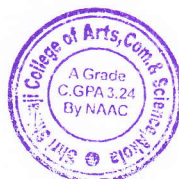

11. WHETHER OBJECTIVES WERE ACHIEVED : Yes, the objectives were achieved.

The process of documentation and collection of data about information, knowledge, skills, attitudes and beliefs was done. Monitoring and correctional need assessment was done by providing guidance to field functionaries for effective implementation of the component Training Module was designed for measuring goal accomplishment, program strengths, its impacts on program participants and community, lessons were shared and opportunities for improvement were identified.

12. ACHIEVEMENTS FROM THE PROJECT: The project proved to be beneficial for enterprising members to help them to realize their potential and find their own way to Save, share and build the capacity of women. Assessment of the process of documenting the data and guidance to field functionaries was facilitated.

13. SUMMARY OF THE FINDINGS: The success in the Training Module on Textile Craft was shown in the ability to perform the performance standards found in each learning outcome. This was achieved by assessing the benefits to the individual and benefits to employer.

Judging of the Skill Development was done to judge the effectiveness of the Training Programme. On the basis of scores given by judges, it was indicated that there was no agreement between the judges for skill achieved by the trainees as in the first week.. However, there is agreement between the judges for skill up gradation as indicated by T -test. (paired samples test was employed to measure the difference in skills achieved before training and after training) .There was significant difference in skills attained. Judges were in agreement that the trainees could achieve skill during the period of three weeks.

The Trainees expressed their views at the end of the Training Programme. For this a semi structured questionnaire was designed. The trainees were satisfied with the Training Module as the objectives of the training were clearly defined. The demonstration and training was organized and easy to follow with adequate raw materials available

The trainer achieved knowledge and the skills were mastered by most of them. They thought that the time allotted for the training was sufficient and were assertive about the benefits of the skills.

14. CONTRIBUTION TO THE SOCIETY: The study was proved to be successful in assisting trainees to transfer learned skills and behavior into their work. Small loans (ranging from Rs 1,000 to Rs 10,000) are provided for individuals in SHGs, along with training on management, marketing and investments. As a result of such economic development initiatives, many small businesses expand and become viable. This approach is very powerful in lifting communities from economic poverty, ultimately leading the community to be self-reliant and live with dignity. The emerging socioeconomic scenario is poised to drive the demand for skilling India. Efforts were made to build the capacity of SHGs realizing the fact that the women in the community

position to combine their resources and talents for enabling viable income generating activities, as compared to a lone individual's efforts. . Many of the SHGs have developed and flourished to become trend setters and per leaders in their region. The time has now come to consider the transformation of those SHGs which have developed considerable capacity and experience to further expand into larger community based organizations. Such organizations can operate on a bigger scale and therefore take advantage of their economies of scale to bring down costs and become more competitive in the markets; they are also in a position to shift from micro credit to larger credit facilities offered by banking institutions and thus will come into their own as a formidable economic force.
